Rosarito

Sensory Stimulation

Just past the beaches of Tijuana and its landmark bullring, visitors pass two golf courses close to Rosarito. Bajamar has 27 holes and an 81 room hotel, and Real Del Mar has an 18-hole course and 71 guest rooms. The drive overlooks the shimmering Pacific with the pristine Los Coronados islands gracing the horizon.

Rosarito is a seaside community that offers long, wide, white sandy beaches famous for surfing, fishing, parasailing, jet skiing, and horseback riding along the right water's edge! Excellent shopping, great food, and a high-energy atmosphere explodes at night where live music, dancing,



karaoke, and mechanical bull-riding can be found at one of the many clubs and quaint local bars along the strip.

Whether you're in the mood for a raging party or a quiet chat in a local restaurant overlooking the sea, Rosarito will fulfill your preference. Just south of the strip, nestled along the soothing waters of the Pacific Ocean, the small village of Puerto Nuevo is the lobster connoisseur's



choice in Baja California. With approximately 25 restaurants specializing in preparing the fresh, locally caught crustaceans, there are a wide variety of dishes to choose from, all at a very reasonable price.

The Maquiladora

The benefits of cooperation

The maquiladora is an American or foreign-owned factory in Mexico, which is allowed to bring manufacturing equipment, materials and components for finished products across the border tariff free. The factories benefit from utilizing the highly skilled, affordable Mexican labor force.



While many believe maquiladoras are a relatively new manufacturing option, born out of the NAFTA, they actually began to develop in increasing numbers way back in 1964, when the initiation of the Maquiladora Program allowed them to be 100% foreign owned. Aiming to foster border region employment rates as well as further attract foreign investment, the program was a great success. Although these programs encouraged foreign-owned production facilities, product sales to Mexican markets were controlled. A new maquiladora decree was issued in 1989, and further relaxed Mexico's foreign investment laws, as well as allowing maquiladoras to sell up to 100% of their production to Mexican domestic markets.

While NAFTA actually eliminated some customs benefits enjoyed by maquiladora operators and defined strict "rules of origin" for products to qualify for preferential tariffs, the laws remain business friendly and hundreds of Fortune 500 to small and medium-sized firms continue to increase profit margins by manufacturing in Tijuana.

Ensenada

"Cinderella of the Pacific"

Just an hour drive south of Rosarito lies the port city of Ensenada, with a raw beauty and emerging potential earning it the nickname "Cinderella of the Pacific." A comfortable Mediterranean-like climate, rustic, nautical feel, and warmth of Mexican culture mingle with fresh salt-air breezes, attracting visitors in great numbers by land, air, and sea. Ensenada is the second most visited port-of-call for cruise ships and pleasure boats in all of Mexico.

The city has a unique mix of sleepy Mexican charm and robust nightlife that satisfies the variety of tastes of those traveling through. The waterfront market features fresh, off-the-dock fish and shellfish served from a multitude of quaint, colorful stands offering some of the tastiest seafood cocktails and tacos on the west coast. Here one can also

charter a local boat and experience world-class fishing firsthand. In late summer and throughout the fall, tuna, marlin, dorado, and other pelagic species are often just miles offshore of the busy port. Just to the south lie acres of vineyards and farms, and roadside stands sell locally grown produce, olives, and honey, among other palate pleasing fare. What Mexican ambiance the border cities have lost in dilution from its northern neighbor, Ensenada maintains and makes up for it by being far enough into the heart of Baja to possess traditional country charm, yet still close enough to enjoy in a single day's travel.







The Corporate Shelter

The Best Way to Cross the Border

The corporate shelter program has been in use since the 1960's, and allows American-owned manufacturing firms to establish a maquiladora in Mexico without owning a Mexican business. The process is quite simple. The American company wishing to manufacture in Mexico contracts a firm specializing in providing shelter services. Based on the specific manufacturing or assembly needs of the

client, the shelter firm looks for and leases an appropriately-sized building for them, and handles all of the real estate transactions, permits and legal work required to acquire the facility. The shelter service also acquires the maquiladora register, import permits, and local and federal licenses and permits. Bank accounts and an accounting and tax payment program are established, and employees are interviewed and hired. The foreign manufacturing firm moves equipment and machinery required for assembly or manufacturing to the facility, and designates a production supervisor to ensure quality control.



Once the operation is established and running, the shelter firm ensures compliance with all Mexican laws and regulations. Research and management required for fiscal compliance with transfer pricing, permanent establishment, safe harbor, asset taxes, and payroll, withholding and employee benefits packages are also handled by the shelter firm. Ongoing personnel management as well as compliance with labor laws and the labor board are performed as part of the shelter package as well.

Additionally, the shelter firm can handle all border crossing and transportation arrangements. The American firm maintains complete control of product quality while he shelter firm performs all functions required to keep the operation running smoothly.

The efficiency of Border Assembly, Inc.'s shelter services has advanced to a point where an American business could potentially establish a Mexican operation in as few as six weeks without even crossing the border. The American manufacturer profits substantially from labor costs cut in half, while bypassing any challenges associated with establishing a factory in Tijuana themselves.

San Felipe



Coastal Desert Jewel

The largest, northernmost community on the western shores of the magnificent Gulf of Mexico, San Felipe poses a stark contrast to Pacificside cities of Baja. Although only a four and a half hour drive from San Diego, this small city founded in 1916 as a commercial fishing port emerges from its desert surroundings with an oasis of cultural charm. Delicious Mexican cuisine and fresh seafood can be found throughout the city, the beaches are wide and white, and the sea is so warm and salty even the most well-fed visitors won't have trouble floating in it!

The fishing on this side of the Baja peninsula is spectacular as well, with good catches possible right from shore, in a Mexican open boat called a "panga" launched through the surf, or for more serious anglers, from one of San Felipe's famous "motherships," which will take you deep in the gulf for multi-day fishing adventures. Other activities in the area include sailing, off-roading in dune buggies, motorcycles, or "quads," horseback riding, desert hiking, and of course, plenty of shopping,

eating and drinking if you so desire. San Felipe offers visitors both a unique array of activities and a wonderfully warm, sunny climate.





The Mexican Labor Pool

Employee Extraordinaire

There's a reason Tijuana is the television-making capital of the world. The conscientious, highly-skilled workforce is perfectly suited to produce electronics in as fine a quality as anywhere in the world. Other products manufactured or assembled in maquiladoras include computers and components, food, textiles, apparel, shoes, furniture, chemical products, automobiles, equipment and accessories, tools, toys, and sporting goods.

Young, diverse, focused, even-tempered, hard-working individuals are the backbone of the successful maquiladora industry. While wages may appear inordinately low compared to those of the U.S., the cost of living is substantially less in Mexico, and maquila workers enjoy numerous benefits including housing and transportation allowances, profit-sharing, paid vacations, health care, and performance bonuses. Maquiladoras in the Mexican state of Baja California alone employ more than 200,000 people, and the border economy has grown substantially since the American-owned factories flourished in the 1980s.



San Diego

In addition to the best climate in the United States, San Diego has worlds to offer residents and visitors alike. A booming economy, low unemployment rate, and balanced blend of business and social
